第二部分 阅读理解

21. D 细节理解题。由 Deep Amazon “Adventurous travelers with a moderate to very good level of fitness and some previous camping experience.”可知, 这个旅游项目除了要求人们有良好的身体素质之外, 还要求有露营经验。

22. A 细节理解题。由 Rainforest & Culture 中的..learn about a way of life nearly lost. 可知, 在那里人们 可以了解一种几近消失的生活方式。

23. C 细节理解题。由对 Bolivia Bike and Hike “Remote windswept highlands with fantastic views of the snow covered Andes mountains.”可知, 在旅途中人们可以远眺白雪皑皑的安第斯山脉。

24. D 推理判断题, 从第一段 but to guide flocks of white-fronted geese through safe migration paths 可知, Christian Moullec 驾驶轻型飞机的主要目的是引导野鹅安全迁徙。

25. B 推理判断题。全文多处都能感受到。从第一段 “to guide flocks through safe migration paths which the birds can teach future generations.” 到第四段“To help raise funds and awareness of his job to protect not just the geese but birds worldwide”可知, Moullec 热爱并保护鸟类生态, 唤起人们关爱鸟类意识。

26. C 细节理解题。从“Moullec believes the use of agricultural chemicals has done harm to wild European birds, with more than a third disappearing in the last 30 years.”可知。

27. D 主旨大意题。通读全文, 可知文章侧重描述帮助迁徙。

28. C 推理判断题。分析第一段可知, 作者通过描述花园带给人们的愉悦而引出生命的花园, 即通过类比引出本文的话题。

29. C 细节理解题。从第二段 “Just as a beautiful garden is a work in progress, so is the garden in your mind. It takes conscious effort, planning, constant nurturing(培育) and weeding to grow a garden.” 可知, 我们生命的花园也需要努力和培育, 这跟我们现实生活中的花园是一样的。

30. D 推理判断题。从第三段的 “Negative energy and words, like weeds, will spread quickly if left unchecked.” 可知, 负能量和充满负能量的语言像杂草一样, 如果不及时清除就会蔓延。

31. C 细节理解题。从第三段的 a book, an inspirational story, a positive statement 可知, 我们

35. B 主旨大意题。综合全文,本文主要报道一款可以帮助盲人阅读的智能眼镜,故选 D。

36. E 第一段介绍两类书籍: fiction books 和 self-improvement books. “On the other hand”前说明了 fiction books 的设计和写作方式可以鼓励读者读下去,更受读者欢迎;“on the other hand”后与之形成对比的 self-improvement books 大多不是故事体。空格处应该顺承原文,说明读者不太喜欢 self-improvement books,与 fiction books 形成对比,E 项符合语境且其中的 This 指代前文,与前文合理衔接。

37. A 通读段落,由段落中的关键信息“open up all kinds of future chances”“learn new things, be inspired, and develop a deep love for practical knowledge and wisdom”“use the ideas and advice, in your daily life”“get positive results”可以概括出,这段详细介绍了读 self-improvement books 的诸多好处,空格处与前后文应为并列或递进关系,A 项在逻辑和语境上均符合。

38. D 空格后的一句说明“秘诀在于了解你目前的处境,并对你希望在未来取得的成就有一个清晰的构想”,D 项“那么,我们如何选择一本合适的自我提升类书目”与之呼应,且 D 项作为段落主题句统领下文。

39. C 空格后语境的逻辑为: identify all the problems you're facing → figure out the cause → keep the problem and the cause in mind → choose a book. B 项中的“take a good look at yourself and your life”(好好审视自己和自己的生活)是发现自己的问题,进而弄清楚原因,再由此找到适合自己的书的前提,与下文的“In this way”衔接合理。
