Paragraph 1:

Paragraph 2:

It took 8 hours and 344 stitches (缝针) to rebuild Kelly's face. She looked quite different today. She used to have a straight long nose, thin lips and high cheekbones; now she got a pug nose, flat cheeks and much bigger lips instead. She also had a few other visible scars. You know, how difficult the situation was to a five-year-old boy." Rocky's heroics were big news then. But the spunky youngster insisted he didn't do anything extraordinary. 评分原则

1. 本题总分为 25 分，按 5 个档次给分。
2. 评分时，先根据文章的内容和语言初步确定其所属档次，然后以该档次的要求来衡量，确定或调整档次，最后给分。
3. 所续写短文的词数应为 150 左右（词数少于 130 的，从总分中减去 2 分）。
4. 阅卷评分时，主要从以下四个方面考虑：
 - (1) 与所给短文及段落开头语的衔接程度；
 - (2) 内容的丰富性和对所标出关键词语的应用情况；
 - (3) 应用语法结构和词汇的丰富性和准确性；
 - (4) 故事发展的合理性和上下文的连贯性。
5. 拼写与标点符号是语言准确性的一个方面，评分时，应视其对交际的影响程度予以考虑。英、美拼写和词汇用法均可。
6. 如书写较差以致影响交际，可将分数降低一个档次。
7. 对于文中有下划线的词可以有词形的变化。但用不够 5 个划线词的，不能上最高档。原则上每缺少一个规定用词，降一档，但表达内容优秀的，可酌情考虑。

各档次给分范围及要求

第五档（21-25 分）

- 与所给短文融洽度高，与所提供各段落开头语衔接合理；
- 内容丰富，应用了 5 个以上短文中标出的关键词语；
- 所使用语法结构和词汇丰富、准确，可能有些许错误，但完全不影响意义表达；
- 有效地使用了语句间的连接成分，使所续写短文结构紧凑。

第四档（16-20 分）

- 与所给短文融洽度较高，与所提供各段落开头语衔接较为合理；
- 内容比较丰富，应用了 5 个以上短文中标出的关键词语；
- 所使用语法结构和词汇较为丰富、准确，可能有些许错误，但完全不影响意义表达；
- 比较有效地使用了语句间的连接成分，使所续写短文结构紧凑。

第三档（11-15 分）

- 与所给短文关系较为密切，与所提供各段落开头语有一定程度的衔接；
- 写出了若干有关内容，应用了 4 个以上短文中标出的关键词语；
- 应用的语法结构和词汇能满足任务的要求，虽有一些错误，但不影响意义的表达；
- 应用简单的语句间的连接成分，使全文内容连贯。

第二档（6-10 分）

- 与所给短文有一定的关系，与所提供各段落开头语有一定程度的衔接；
- 写出了一些有关内容，应用了 3 个以上短文中标出的关键词语；
- 语法结构单调、词汇项目有限，有些语法结构和词汇方面的错误，影响了意义的表达；
- 较少使用语句间的连接成分，全文内容缺少连贯性。

第一档（1-5 分）

- 与所给短文和开头语的衔接较差；
- 产出内容太少，很少使用短文中标出的关键词语；
- 语法结构单调、词汇项目很有限，有较多语法结构和词汇方面的错误，严重影响了意义的表达；
- 缺乏语句间的连接成分，全文内容不连贯。
