21、B 细节理解题。根据第四个广告：Detail: Two-hour classes for £ 24. ([www. Gorillacircus.com](http://www.Gorillacircus.com)) 可知。

22、D 细节理解题。根据第三个广告：Team GB won gold and silver medals here 可知。

23、A 推理判断题。根据第五个广告：Explore London on two wheels on the weekly Sunday Stroll-partner event 和后面网站可知。

B

文章讲述了 Bullerick 夫妇受歌手 Barbra 影响决定克隆自己的宠物猫的历程。

24、A 推理判断题。根据第一段：“The couple first began considering...after learning that singer Barbra Streisand had cloned her late dog.” 可知。

25、D 推理判断题。根据第二段：“The couple went on to buy a DNA kit...We kept it for months in our refrigerator while we thought about it” 可知。

26、B 词义猜测题。根据第三段：“who were immediately amazed by the likeness between the two cats...Even their personalities(个性) are similar. They are both energetic.” 可知。

27、C 推理判断题。根据第四段：“This is an animal that we hope will be with us for twenty years.” 及 “We would definitely do it again.” 可知。

35、C 主旨大意题。文章一、二两段通过对比，引出话题“time is more valuable than money”，第三段提出问题“The question is, he says, are you a good manager of your time?”后面围绕“how to be a good time manager”，即“how to make the most of time”分析并解决问题。

36、G。根据空格后面的“You can also volunteer. Volunteering takes ...and makes ...”两句之间的逻辑关系以及句中的用词“also”可以推出：上文的“First, find a hobby”后面必然是讲述“find a hobby”带来的好处。G 项里面的 This 就指代上文的做法“finding a hobby”，且“first”与“also”对应，承接上文。

37、C。该题位于段首，结合小标题可知，该句应该为段落主题句，与“home”有关。空格后面内容就是围绕 C 项里面的“How you organize your home can make you happier.”展开的。

38、E。该题位于段中，结合小标题和上下文可知，该句应该与“money”有关，只能选 E。

39、A。该题位于段首，结合小标题可知，该句应该为段落主题句，与“social life（社交）”，即“交友（friends）”有关。故选 A。

40、B。该段小标题为“workplace”，既“工作场所”，结合空前的“it should be a place that you like.”及空后的“You don’t want to spend 40 hours a week with people that you dislike.”只能选 B。

47.A 句意：接下来暴风雨就出现(appear)了。

61、**a**。film 为可数名词单数形式，在句中做“Leap”的同位语，表示泛指“一部有关……的电影”。

62、**Directed**。此处应为非谓语动词形式，由句义及后面的“by”可知该行为被动形式，故用过去分词。

63、**on**。考查固定短语“be based on”。

64、**pride**。由前面的冠词 the 可知填“proud”的名词形式。

65、**won**。根据句子结构可知 since 从句缺谓语，所以此处填谓语动词的相应形式。由于 since 引导的是时间状语从句，且从句中的时间状语是过去时间 1981 年，谓语动词应用一般过去式。

66、**including**。根据句义，此处应填非谓语动词形式，空格后面部分是动词 include 的宾语，所以填现在分词。

67、**probably**。根据语境可知该空应该填形容词 probable 的副词形式。

68、**films**。句中的 a series of 意为“一系列的”，后应该接可数名词复数形式。

69、**to meet**。该句为非谓语动词，考查固定搭配“expect sb. to do”的被动形式。

70、**whose**。该句为非限制性定语从句，修饰先行词“another film”，且在从句中 film 与 director 构成所属关系。

短文改错

第一句：take 改为 took； 去掉 visit 后面的 to；

第二句：we 改为 they； art 改为 arts；

第三句：Beside 改为 Besides； made 前加 have；

第四句：amazing 改为 amazed； said 改为 saying；

第五句：it 改为 which； and 改为 but

第一句：句中的时间状语为 Last Sunday，所以谓语动词应用一般过去式；visit 为及物动词，直接跟宾语，相当于 pay a visit to。

第二句：句子主语应为上文的 exchange students，应用第三人称代词指代；art 为可数名词，前面有 some 修饰，所以用复数形式。

第三句：Beside 为介词，意为“在……旁边”，根据句义，应为“此外”，用副词“Besides”；句中时间状语“in the last few centuries”应该与现在完成时连用，所以添加助动词“have”。

第四句：amazing 表示“令人惊讶的”，根据句义应该是“感到惊讶的”，所以改为“amazed”；句子谓语是 were，此处的“说”应该是非谓语形式，后面是说的内容，所以用“saying”，表示补充说明。

第五句：句子中间是逗号，前面是完整的简单句，所以逗号后面应该是从句。根据句义应该是非限制性定语从句，且做从句的主语，所以用“which”，指代先行词“visit”；并列结构“not only... but also...”，该结构中的 also 可以省略。
