Pan Junfan, 40, knew what he had signed up for. “I do not challenge nature, but challenge myself in the natural environment.” Pan told *China Daily*.

Pan’s challenge was originally the Ultra Gobi, a 400-kilometer nonstop race. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, it was canceled. Yet Pan contacted the race’s organizers and then undertook a solo challenge on Sept 9. Beginning from the “Mars Camp” in Qinghai province, the ultra extreme course was expanded to 513 km over sand dunes, dry valleys, and snowy mountains, finishing in Guazhou, Gansu province. Apart from facing extreme temperatures and varied terrains (地形) Pan, carrying the bare minimum of equipment he would need, also battled against sleep lack and health difficulties during the journey.

After running for 208 hours 35 minutes, Pan managed to cross the finish line in Guazhou on Sept 18. With his first 102 km clocking 26 hours and 3 minutes, he broke the record set by Spanish amputee (被截肢者) athlete, Letamendia, in last year’s 101 km race from Italy to France.

“I hope that by completing the challenge I can inspire people and tell them that life has limitless possibilities and not to stop trying.” Pan told *China Daily*. He has live-streamed his race on the video-sharing platform TikTok, attracting over 35 million views.

An internet user named Weixia commented that Pan has completed something impossible for most people and proved that life is too short to hesitate in following dreams.

Pan has been challenging himself since he lost his right leg in a car accident in 2015. Since then, he has been searching the meaning of life. Now, he is back and planning his next challenge — swimming and sailing across the Taiwan Straits. “The meaning of life is to explore the unknown.” he said. Just as his favorite song, US musician Zayde Wolf’s Born Ready, goes:

This is the story of three plastic bottles, empty and abandoned. Their journeys are about to diverge, more or less influencing the fate of our planet.

Bottle One, like hundreds of millions of tons of other plastic bottles, ends up in a landfill. This huge dump expands each day as more trash comes in and continues to take up space. As plastics sit there being pressed among layers of their junk, rainwater flows through the waste and absorbs the chemicals it contains, and some of those are highly poisonous. Together they create harmful matter called leachate (沥滤液), which can move into groundwater, soil and streams, poisoning

ecosystems and harming wildlife. It can take Bottle One 1,000 years to rot away.

Bottle Two's journey is strange. He floats on water that reaches a stream, a stream that flows into a river, and a river that reaches the ocean. After months lost at sea, he's slowly drawn where trash accumulates, a place known as the Great Pacific Garbage Patch. Here the ocean's currents have trapped millions of pieces of plastic waste. There the water becomes a cloudy plastic soup. Some animals, like seabirds, get stuck in the mess. They, and others, mistake the brightly colored plastic things for food. Plastic makes them feel full when they're not, so they starve to death and pass the poisons from the plastic up the food chain. For example, it's eaten by fish, and the fish are eaten by us.

But Bottle Three is spared the cruel suffering of his brothers. A truck brings him to a plant where he and his companions are squeezed flat and pressed into a block. The blocks are cut and torn into tiny pieces, which are washed and melted, so they become the raw materials that can be used again. As if by magic, Bottle Three is now ready to be reborn as something completely new.

For this bit of plastic with such humble origins, suddenly the sky is the limit.
