B

Michelle Yeoh, an iconic name in Chinese cinema, made history on Sunday night by becoming the first Asian woman to win the Academy Award for best actress.

The Malaysian-born actress defeated tough challenger, including two-time winner Cate Blanchett and five-time nominee(被提名者) Michelle Williams, to take home the honored award for her extraordinary performance in the multiverse comedy *Everything Everywhere All at Once*.

The film, where Yeoh plays a struggling laundry owner who ends up being the savior(救世主) of the multiverse, swept the Oscars with a total of seven awards, including for best picture and best director, making it the biggest winner of the night.

"For all the little boys and girls who look like me watching tonight, this is a beacon of hope and possibility," the actress said in her acceptance speech in Los Angeles, California, the United States, to emphasize that one must dream big as dreams do come true. "And ladies, don't let anyone ever tell you (that) you're past your prime(黄金期)," the 60-year-old added.

The actress also used her speech to honor her 84-year-old mother, Janet Yeoh. "I have to dedicate this to my mom and all the moms in the world because they are really the superheroes, and without them none of us would be here tonight," she said.

After carving a career for herself in Kung fu cinema in Hong Kong, Yeoh made her Hollywood debut(首次亮相) in the 1997 James Bond movie *Tomorrow Never Dies*. She gained international recognition for her role as a swordswoman in Ang Lee's iconic film, *Crouching Tiger, Hidden Dragon*, which won three Oscars in 2001.

Calling the actress "a female Jackie Chan", Sha Dan, a film critic, said that Yeoh is the film industry's darling for not only her jaw-dropping performance in action movies, but also her performance in artistic works. *Everything Everywhere All at Once* seems to be specifically crafted for Yeoh because the movie reflects her decades-long efforts to raise the cultural significance of Asian-themed films worldwide, Sha added. His remarks were just part of a stir among Chinese media, with the news hash-tag getting over 430 million views on the popular micro-blogging platform Sina Weibo in just three hours.

Will the AI chatbots eat search engines' lunch? For more than 20 years, search engines have been the Internet's front door. Google has dominated the field in most of the world. But nothing lasts forever, particularly in technology.

Just ask IBM, which once ruled business computing, or Nokia, once the leader in mobile phones. Both fell behind because they didn't follow big technological transitions. Now another tech innovation might announce a similar shift —and a similar opportunity. ChatGPT has put itself on centre stage, by letting people chat with an AI directly. ChatGPT can write essays in various styles, explain complex concepts, summarize texts and answer questions. And it can collect, process and combine knowledge from the web: for example, listing holiday spots that match certain criteria, or suggesting menus or schedules. If asked, it can explain its reasoning and provide details. Many things that people use search engines for today, in short, can be done better with chatbots.

Will ChatGPT help students cheat better? Yes, but as with many other technology developments, it's not a simple black and white situation. Decades ago, students could copy encyclopedia entries, and more recently, they've been able to search the Internet and explore into Wikipedia entries. ChatGPT offers new abilities for everything from helping with research to doing their homework for them. Many ChatGPT answers already sound like student essays. Ask the new artificial intelligence tool ChatGPT to write an essay about the cause of the American Civil War and you can watch it produce a persuasive term paper in a matter of seconds.

It can even (narrowly) pass a number of exams. It scored 60% on the United States Medical Licensing Examination, 70% on an exam for lawyers, 78% on New York state's high school chemistry exam's multiple choice section, and ranked the 40th on the Law School Admission Test.

A high school teacher concluded ChatGPT already writes better than most students today. He's torn between admiring ChatGPT's potential usefulness and fearing its harm to human learning: "Is this moment more like the invention of the calculator, saving me from the boredom of long division, or more like the invention of the player piano, robbing us of what can be communicated only through human emotion?"

Singapore cannot afford to have large plots of land dedicated to growing crops — it is just too small. However, farming, or more precisely, urban farming, is now a buzz word here. Instead of looking at the grounds, Singapore has decided to look skyward, towards rooftops!

In 2020, Singapore announced plans to convert the roofs of nine multi-storey car-parks in public housing areas into spaces for commercially farmed vegetables and other crops. This is part of Singapore's strategy to meet the country's 30 by 30 goal, which is to produce 30% of its nutritional needs locally by 2030 up from 10% in 2020.

Several companies have taken on the task of cultivating the urban farming scene in Singapore. Citiponics has made a name for itself, building water-efficient organic “growing towers” that can be used to grow anything from butterhead lettuce (奶油生菜) to sweet basil (罗勒). In April 2020, they opened the first commercial farm on the rooftop of a multi-storey car park and now sell their produce via their own brand at local supermarkets. Edible Garden City (EGC) has more than 200 farms across the island and works closely with restaurants to ensure sustainable supply and demand. A 460-square-meter farm run by EGC, is positioned on the rooftop of a mall to supply nearby restaurants.

Singapore is not alone in its efforts to go beyond the confines of conventional agriculture. All over the world, cities are seeking to feed their communities with local produce. At Thammasat University located just outside of Bangkok, a formerly disused rooftop has been transformed into a 7,000-square-meter space for organic farming, the largest in Asia.

Urban farming is not restricted to eatable plants such as leafy greens and vegetables. Rooftop Honey, which has over 130 hives throughout various locations in Greater Melbourne specializes in bees. The urban beekeeping operation, founded in 2010, serves two purposes: producing creamy and delicious honey for the city's residents while also allowing the bees to pollinate(授粉) flowers in the surrounding areas.

There are several benefits to have the farms so close to home. Through community gardens or access to commercial-scale farm produce, the public have an opportunity to understand how food is grown. As the produce is pesticide free, there is also comfort in knowing where the food comes from and its impact on the environment.

Days turned to weeks and Nanny's health worsened rapidly in the early months of 2018. Life took me through my full-time study, babysitting and waiting tables, along with the responsibility of caring for a grandparent who was too sick to care for herself. As I helped Nanny in the early hours of those mornings, she would chat to me, sometimes joys, other times, sorrows. Whatever she shared became precious.
