"It sometimes changes a good man into a bad one," said the tall man. "You've been under arrest for ten minutes, 'Silky' Bob. Chicago thinks you may have dropped over our way and wires us she wants to have a chat with you. Before going to the station, here's a note to you, from Patrol man Wells."

The man unfolded the note, reading:

"Bob: I was at the appointed place on time. When you struck the match, I saw it was the face wanted in Chicago. Somehow I couldn't do it myself, so I went around and got a plain clothes man to do the job. JIMMY."

### C

We're all told time and again just how important it is to exercise for good health. But with busy schedules, finding the time to work out is often easier said than done. For many people, the weekend is the only time to exercise. Here is the question: do those "weekend warriors" benefit from workout?

In a study, the researchers looked at 60,000 adults aged 40 and over. Data on the participants was collected by the Health Survey for England and the Scottish Health Survey between 1994 and 2012. Participants were also asked about their exercise habits. They were then categorized as "weekend warrior" (two days per week), "regularly active" (three days per week), "inactive" (exercising less than 150minutes per week). By comparing how many from each category had died during the study, the researchers found that weekend warrior exercisers had a 30% lower risk of premature death from all causes compared to inactive people. Risk of death from cardiovascular (心血管的) disease was also around 40% lower, while risk of death from all types of cancer was around 18% lower. Regularly active people had the best health overall — and had a 5% lower risk of premature death from any cause compared to weekend warriors.

While this research gives hope to those weekend warriors, it must be interpreted with caution, because the data was self-reported by participants, some of whom may have reported the amount of exercise more than they really did. Also, the amount of exercise participants reported on only referred to the amount they did in the four weeks prior to the interview, which might not actually represent how much they did for the duration of the 20-year study. The researchers also excluded the physical activity a person did as part of their job. This is relevant as it can also contribute to lower risk of death from disease.

Anyway, the key message from this study is that doing some physical activity is better than doing nothing, even if you just squeeze it all in on a weekend.

#### D

At a warehouse northwest of London, dozens of workers are bustling around. The storehouse for The Entertainer chain of toy shops is getting busier as Christmas approaches. But the company’s chairman, Gary Grant, is concerned about meeting sustained demand as the UK wrestles with a supply chain crisis.

“Our challenge is now releasing containers from the port, we’re struggling with lorry drivers,” he told AFP. “We need more warehouse workers,” he added.

Caught between post-Brexit labour shortages and rising costs for raw materials and transport, the British toy retail industry is facing a potential terrible crisis before Christmas.

The Entertainer, which with its online business claims a 10 percent share of the UK toy market, makes half its turnover between the beginning of October and December. It usually hires temporary staff before the annual rush to receive, handle and send lorries full of various popular toys in the busy period.

But 2021 has caused a real headache, Grant explained, with many temporary workers, many of them from eastern Europe, now missing because of tighter post-Brexit immigration rules. Besides, Britain is short of 100,000 lorry drivers, which has caused delivery problems across various sectors for weeks, leading to delays and empty shelves, especially when thousands of items have to be transported from ports to warehouses, then on to the high street.

To compound problems, Britain’s largest port, Felixstowe, has been battling a backlog (积压, 存货), with container ships full of Christmas goods being diverted to the European mainland. Britain’s full departure from the European Union in January has piled extra administrative difficulty and costs onto companies like The Entertainer, which also has 34 stores in Spain.

“When we export to Europe to our stores there, we have to pay more duties,” said Grant, “That, unavoidably, means Santa will have to pick up the bill.”

Apart from usual difficulties, like trying to meet demand for predicted festive best-sellers, Grant is confident even though restocking could become tricky in the coming weeks. “There will be no empty toy shops this Christmas.” he said.


