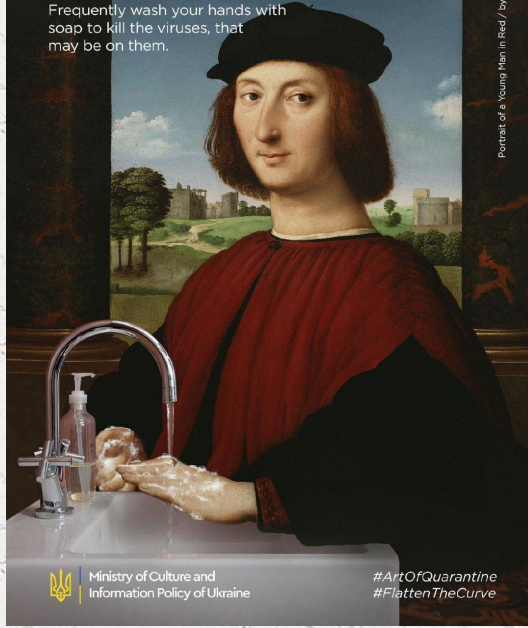

Frequently wash your hands with soap to kill the viruses, that may be on them.

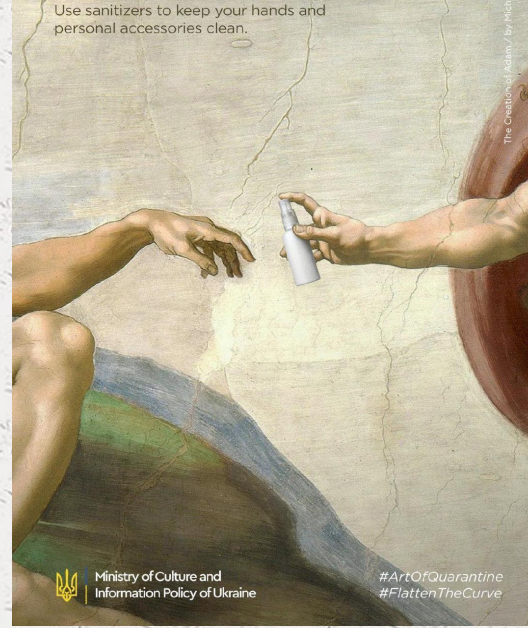

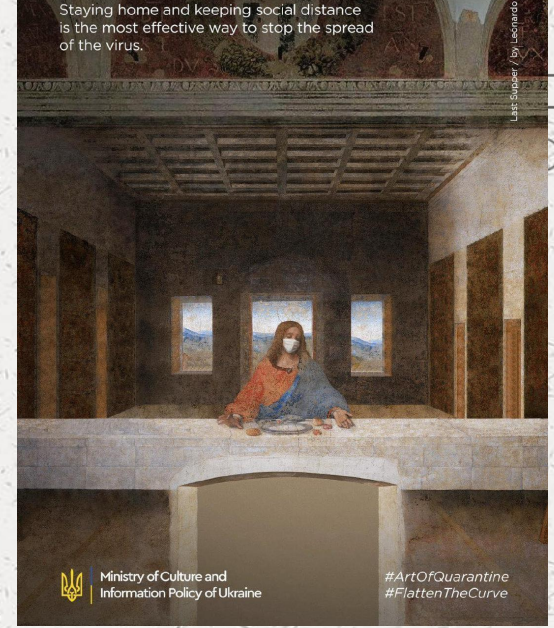

Wear disposable gloves to avoid contact with potentially infected surfaces.

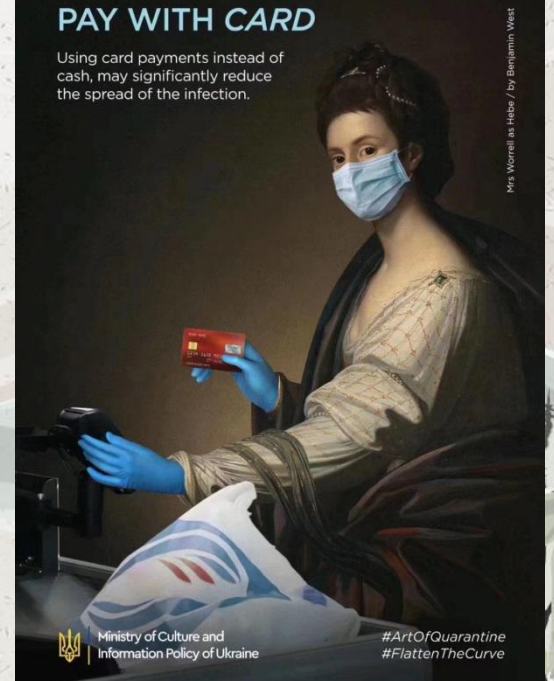

The Ministry of Education has set three conditions for school resumption, namely, the epidemic is under basic control (得到基本控制) where the schools are located, schools are capable of epidemic prevention (疫情防控), and safeguarding the health and safety (卫生安全) of teachers and students.

"Our head teacher has reminded us to wear masks (戴口罩), do disinfection (消毒) and take body temperature (量体温) when we go to school, and my parents have prepared masks, hand sanitizer (洗手液) and a thermometer (体温计) for me," said Chen.

Dong Yaping, whose daughter will attend Gaokao this year, said she is confident that students will be safe in the school, where each class will be divided into two smaller groups and each dormitory accommodate no more than four boarding students to reduce cross-infection risks.

"My daughter has been moved by the medical workers' stories in the fight against the epidemic and learned to love our country more, which I think is more important than only performing well academically," said Dong.

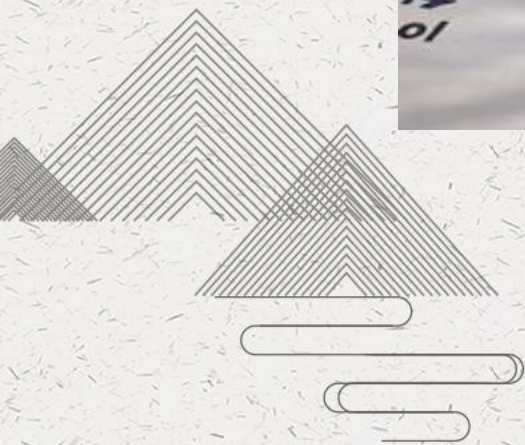

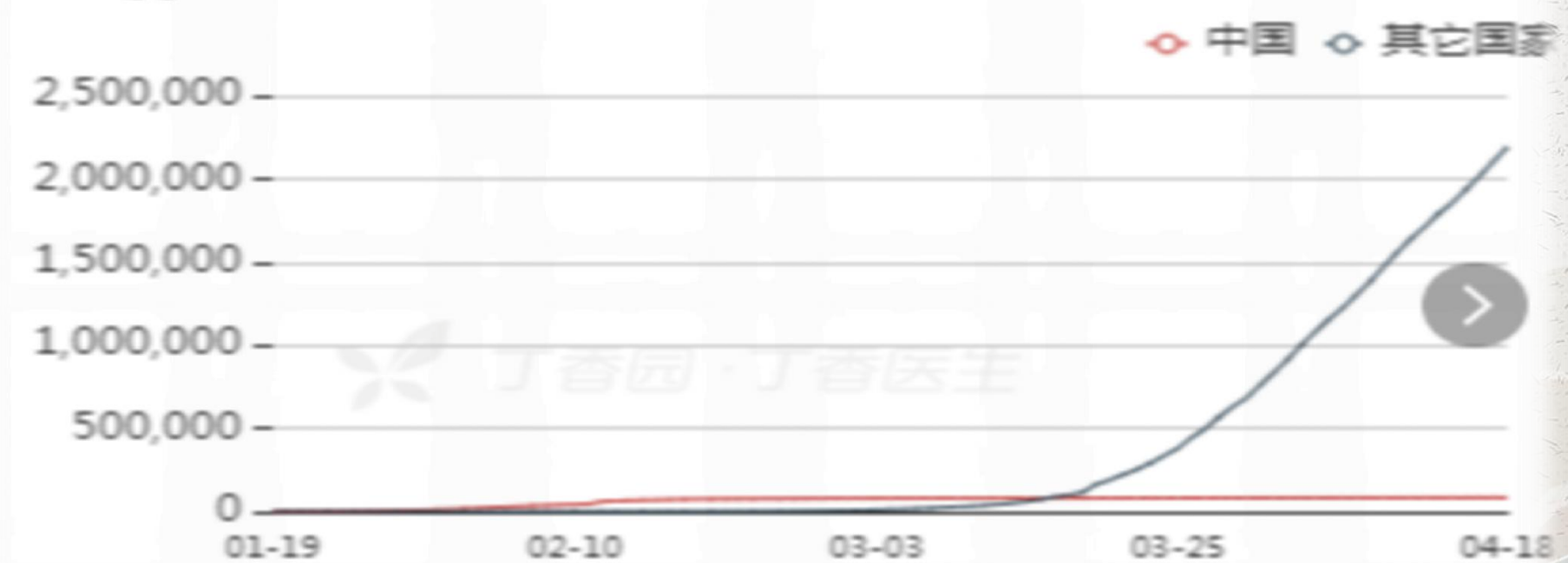

全球疫情累计确诊趋势图





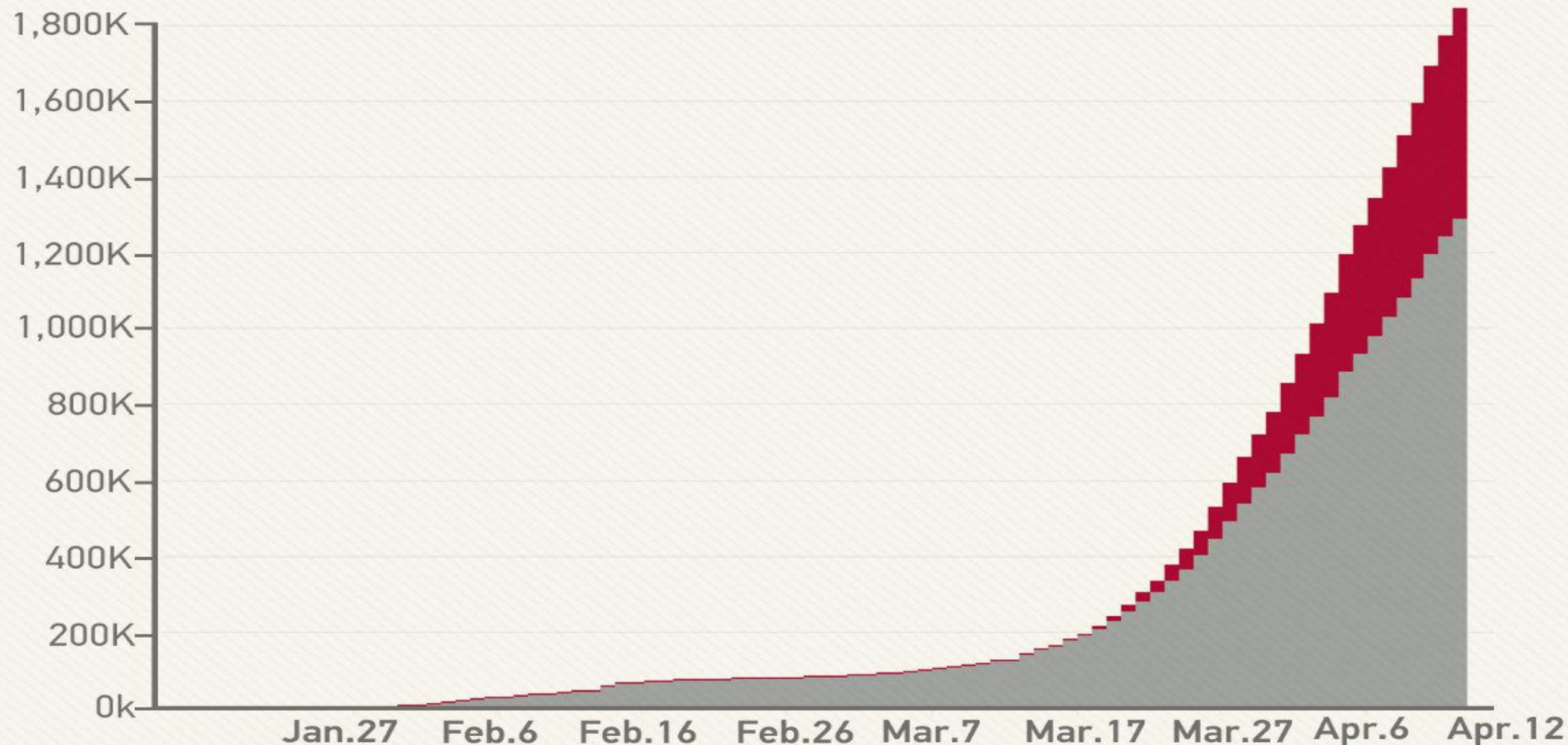

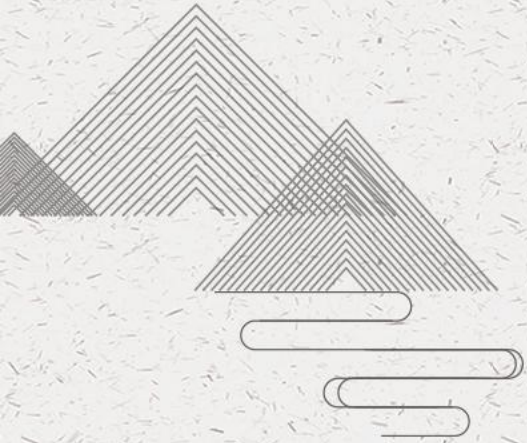
The government has assured residents they may walk their pets, so long as they observe social distancing measures such as keeping 1m apart from other members of the public.
