

When you fall ill, you can go to hospital for treatment. However, if it is a serious illness or injury, first aid should be performed immediately to save life before an ambulance comes. Here are some suggestions when a person suffers an electric shock. The first thing to remember is not to move a person with an electrical injury unless he or she is in immediate danger. If the injured person has such symptoms as severe burns and difficulty breathing, seek emergency care as soon as possible. When waiting for medical help, you can take some actions. For example, Turn off the source of electricity, if possible. You can also apply a bandage to the burned areas. Treating the injured person in a proper way before medical help comes can always <u>make a difference</u>.
