




- 1. <u>embassy</u> a group of officials led by an ambassador who represent their government in a foreign country



His love for the Mississippi River accounted for his pen name. In many people's eyes, writers are usually poor, and probably in rags On the contrary , Mark Twain earned a great deal of money from his writings. He also took a chance in investment, though he lost a lot of money in it. The author of many famous works such as The Adventures of Tom Sawyer (1876) and The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn (1885), Mark Twain is indeed "the father of American literature".
